Travel + Leisure readers don't need destination dupes—they're here for the greatest hits. Our reader-voted 100 best hotels of 2025 list boasts properties in 33 countries across five continents. From resorts that date back to the 19th century to the newly opened swish boutiques that shot straight to the top, these are the 100 best hotels of 2025 across the globe, according to our readers.

How Voting Works

Every year for our World's Best Awards survey, T+L asks readers to weigh in on travel experiences around the globe—to share their opinions on the top hotels, resorts, cities, islands, cruise ships, spas, airlines, and more. Nearly 180,000 T+L readers completed the 2025 survey. A total of more than 657,000 votes were cast across over 8,700 properties (hotels, cities, cruise lines, etc.).

Hotels were classified as either resort hotel, city hotel, inn, or safari lodge based on their location and amenities, and they were specifically rated on the criteria below:

- Rooms/facilities
- Location
- Service
- Food
- Value

For each characteristic, respondents could choose a rating of excellent, above average, average, below average, or poor. The final scores are averages of these responses.

What Readers Loved

As T+L readers search for hotels that draw them in—with a rich backstory, entrancing interiors, and authentic, local experiences—they don't shy from trying a new stay: seven of the 100 best hotels of 2025 opened in the last two years. And yet, it's the <u>exceptional service</u> at tried-and-true favorites that turns curious travelers into return guests.

For the second year in a row, only one U.S. hotel cracked the top 10, which is otherwise dominated by safari lodges (No. 1 <u>andBeyond</u> <u>Bateleur Camp</u> and No. 3 <u>Mfuwe Lodge, The Bushcamp Company</u>), as well as far-flung island resorts (<u>Joali Maldives</u> at No. 7 and newcomer Nay Palad in the tenth spot).

Among the top 100 favorites from T+L readers, there are 18 U.S. hotels on this year's list, up from the 16 that placed last year. Of the U.S. stays, sprawling, remote resorts stood out—like <u>Primland Resort, Auberge</u> <u>Resorts Collection</u>, the 12,000-acre stay in Virginia's Blue Ridge Mountains (No. 8), and Wildflower Farms, Auberge Resorts Collection (No. 54) in New York's bucolic Hudson Valley. But in the heart of Carmelby-the-Sea, a charming Northern California town, Villa Mara (No. 40) came back to once again rank in the top 50—a rarity for a relatively new and independently owned boutique hotel.

As the U.S. winners hint, Auberge Resorts Collection had a phenomenal

year, with eleven resorts on the list. Capella, voted the best hotel brand for the third year in a row, had three winners; Oberoi, also a favorite hotel brand among readers, received four nods. And yet, it's a luxury safari outfitter with 29 lodges and camps that nabbed the top spot in this fiercely competitive World's Best Awards category.

Maasai Mara National Reserve, Kenya

Situated on a private concession in Kenya's Masai Mara, this 19-tent property is a luxe base for seeking out the Big Five. The tents are perhaps the first draw, with indoor and outdoor showers, locally sourced furniture inspired by the surroundings, and private decks, perfect for listening to the distant roar of lions or the chorus of insects. Then there's the caring staff, who help provide access to memorable experiences like al fresco meals on the banks of the Mara River and hot-air balloon rides over the Great Migration.

Raffles Istanbul

Istanbul, Turkey

A frequent World's Best winner since it opened in 2014, this quietly elegant oasis, situated on a hill with sweeping views of the city and the Bosphorus, has 185 rooms and suites paired with round-the-clock butler service. This year, it tops the Istanbul list of hotels, too.

Mfuwe Lodge, the Bushcamp Company

South Luangwa National Park, Zambia

Scenic views of the Mfuwe Lagoon, on-property elephant sightings between late October and mid-December, and 18 modern, airconditioned lodges led this property to one of the highest scores on this year's list. But what really caught the attention of our readers was its team. "It has the most wonderful staff and is the most well-run property in Africa," one reader claimed.





Fauchon L'Hôtel

Paris, France

Since the 1880s, the Fauchon brand has been associated with the pinnacle of French gastronomy—the company is one of the most renowned fine delicatessens in France. Set on the Place de la Madeleine, Fauchon's first hotel carries on that tradition, with a focus on excellent food and drink, and decor that riffs on the company's signature magenta color scheme.

Kilindi Zanzibar

Zanzibar, Tanzania

Originally built for ABBA band member Benny Andersson, this resort from the Elewana Collection sits on 50 acres of lush gardens and features 15 domed suites, each with a plunge pool and views over the Indian Ocean.

Mendoza, Argentina

Just 21 villas—donned with soaking tubs, rooftop terraces, and panoramic views of the Andes—create an intimate retreat, perfect for wine-lovers. A favorite experience for readers? Getting their hands dirty by harvesting grapes and making custom wine at the on-site vineyards.



Joali Maldives

Raa Atoll, Maldives

Traditional luxury experiences, such as water activities and a high-end spa, pair perfectly with the soulful nature of this 73-villa resort. And while many hotels on the Raa atoll are adults-only, children are more than welcome at Joali, where activities like pottery classes and treasure hunts draw interest.





La Casa de la Playa

Playa del Carmen, Mexico

La Casa de la Playa snagged a spot in the top 10, with readers flocking to the 63-suite-only hotel for access to the larger Grupo Xcaret campus, restaurants by acclaimed chefs, an ocean-view spa, and an on-site chocolate shop. "The rooms are spectacular," added one reader of the butler-serviced quarters adorned with local art.

Meadows of Dan, Virginia

"One of the nicest resorts on the East Coast," said one reader of this

12,000-acre bucolic escape in the Blue Ridge Mountains. Travelers come to this coveted Auberge Resorts Collection property for horseback riding and hiking through the incomparable scenery.

Siargao Island, Philippines

This Philippines all-inclusive, which opened in 2023 and was named one of the best new hotels in the world in T+L's 2024 It List, has only 10 villas, each outfitted with a private patio and outdoor shower. Set in the surfing capital of the Philippines, this beachfront resort is within easy walking distance of the isle's downtown.

Punta de Mita, Mexico

Occupying a nearly 2,000-square-foot-long beach, Susurros del Corazon is one of the Auberge Resorts Collection's newest Mexico hotels. The interiors celebrate the country's craftwork—textiles from Oaxaca, wooden headboards sourced from Guadalajara—and the on-site experiences highlight another phenomenal Mexican export: the wine.

Los Olivos, California

In the Santa Ynez Valley, a charming central California wine region, The Inn at Mattei's Tavern is a gorgeous reimagining of a 19th-century hotel within walking distance of 27 tasting rooms in downtown Los Olivos. One reader cited the "relaxing vibe" at the intimate hotel as a major draw.

Bali, Indonesia

There are only eight Ritz-Carlton Reserve properties in the world, all of which offer an over-the-top stay with luxe accommodations, phenomenal dining, and a true sense of place. Mandapa is built into the rice paddies of Ubud, and from the private pool villas lining the Ayung River, guests can hear the water rushing past.





Regent Hong Kong

Hong Kong, China

For the second year in a row, this fixture of Hong Kong has secured the No. 1 spot on our list of Asia city hotels, following a thoughtful renovation that added touches of understated glamour, such as Lasvit glass bricks in the entryway. But it's the location, right in the heart of the city, that really drew readers in.

Istanbul, Turkey

Champagne, France

This 47-room property is an idyllic countryside retreat, set among the scenic Champagne hills. It charms readers with its modern design, Michelin-starred restaurant, and outstanding spa with a hammam, two infinity pools, and quality services creating a wellness sanctuary in its own right.

The Oberoi Rajvilas, Jaipur

Jaipur, India

This palace-inspired escape near the heart of Jaipur is so over the top that peacocks can be seen roaming around its grounds. But that's really just a nice perk on top of the in-room private plunge pools, long list of treatments at the guest-only spa, and "exceptional service," as one reader put it.



Fairmont Kea Lani, Maui

Maui, Hawaii

This Oetker Collection hotel celebrates its 100th anniversary in 2025 and our readers have been its regular guests on Rue du Faubourg Saint-Honoré in the eighth arrondissement. A recent reason to book a stay: the newly opened Le Jardin Français, a serene, tucked-away patio, surrounded by lush green flora, serving afternoon tea and evening tapas.
